now or on January 1, 2010.

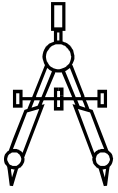
A few weeks ago we heard the story of

Are you having a bad day?

Let me introduce to you Col. Edward Hubbard, USAF ret. I met him at a motivational seminar where he was the main facilitator. Col. Hubbard went to work at 4am on July 20, 1966. He flew his plane on a recon mission in Viet Nam. He was shot down; he and one crew member were able to bail out. He never saw the crew member again. After hiding in the jungle for several hours a shaggy dog sniffed him out and the farmers turned him over the North Vietnamese Army and was taken as a POW.

On the way to the prison, he was beaten several times thinking he had classified information. He had known. When he arrived at the prison he was beaten everyday for 40 days as the Viet Cong was convinced he had classified information. On the 41st day, the beatings stopped but other tortures were endured and this continued for the entire 2420 days he was held captive. This equates to six years and six months. He was released on March 4, 1973 and he said " he has not had a bad day since."

The only thing that kept him going was his ability to focus on what was waiting for him when he was finally released. He and other POW's always had faith in God and they would be freed. He willed himself to find something positive every day to think about. When he returned to the USA he earned five

degrees within 7 years. He has written and lectured on the power of the human mind to overcome adversity. He is a person that is truly an American Hero and a role model for the rest of us that think we are having a bad day.

Ohio District 3 Master Sir Knight Charles A. Giametta is pleased to announce that an Exemplification to the Fourth Degree of our Order will be held October 24th at the Marietta Knights of Columbus Hall, 301 Gilman Street, Marietta, Ohio.

The Headquarters Hotel TBD in Marietta, Ohio. A Block of 10 Rooms will be reserved.

The Exemplification will be held at the K of C Council 478 Hall at 301 Gilman Street, Marietta, Ohio promptly at 1 PM. All candidates must be registered by Noon and Observers present.

The Exemplification Mass will be held at 4:00 pm following the Exemplification This is a regularly scheduled Parish Mass and we will be joining with the Congregation to celebrate the Mass.

Following Mass we will return to the Knights of Columbus Hall to Celebrate the Day at the Masters Banquet. The Banquet will be a full dinner. A cash bar will be available prior to and during the Banquet.

The Fee for the Candidates will be \$80.00. This includes the \$70.00 fee for the Exemplification, (Supreme fees, Social Baldrick, Membership Pin, and Masters Banquet) plus a sack lunch and an 8X10 Class Picture (\$15.00 value). Candidates choosing not to receive the Class Picture and sack lunch must so indicate on the Registration Form and then would only pay \$70.00.

The cost for guests to attend the Masters Banquet is \$30.00. Sack lunches will be available on a pre-ordered basis for \$5.00 each and a ticket will be required. The Lady's Program will include a luncheon and entertainment at a cost of \$15.00 per person. Please be sure to indicate your choices and numbers attending on the Registration Form.

The District will publish an Ad book and this will begin the 2009-2010 AD BOOK Program as announced at the June District Meeting. Ad Forms will be available on line. Remember your Assembly must purchase a full page Ad in both the Fall and Spring Ad Books to qualify for the program rebates.

Dress Requirements for the Exemplification Weekend

The Basic Uniform for the Fourth Degree is:

Black Single Breasted Tuxedo (no tails), White Tuxedo shirt (pleated Front) with lay-down collar (no wing collar), Black Studs that may have a gold or silver band, Black bow tie & cummerbund, white gloves, black socks, and plain toe black dress shoes highly polished. (Vests are not to be worn). Once a Candidate becomes a “Sir Knight” either the Social Baldric or Military Baldric is also worn.

When wearing the **Social Baldric** Sir Knights may wear Knights of Columbus miniature Jewels of Past Offices on the left breast pocket of the Tuxedo, their current Jewel of Office (either 3rd or 4th Degree only one may be worn), one pin of their choice on the left lapel and an appropriate Name Badge or Pin. (No Military awards are to be worn)

When wearing the **Military Baldric** the fourth Degree Brotherhood Pin will be worn on the left lapel, miniature KofC and Papal Order Jewels may be worn above the Left Breast Pocket, **NO** other Jewels, Medals, Pins or Badges may be worn unless so instructed by the Master. Only Current Faithful Navigators may wear their Jewel of Office. (the order of miniature jewels from the left arm pit to your heart PFN, PGK, FM, FDD, FVSM, PSD, PSO, Papal Order)

Saturday:

Registration: Dress is casual

Exemplification: Candidates: Basic Uniform with Candidate Ribbon (No Baldric)

Sir Knights Full Regalia, (Exception only by permission of the Master)

Ladies Brunch: Business Casual

Mass: New Sir Knights: Basic Uniform (no Gloves) with Candidate Ribbon & Social Baldric

Sir Knights: Basic Uniform (no Gloves) with Social Baldric Ladies and Guests: Business Dressy to Formal (Many of the Ladies wear to Mass what they will wear to the Master’s Banquet.)

Master’s Banquet: Sir Knights: Basic Uniform (no Gloves) with Social Baldric Ladies and

Guests: Business Dressy to Formal

Hospitality Rooms - Dress is casual (*Note: Sir Knights and Candidates that our Uniform is to be worn Complete that means with the Jacket on at all times and for Sir Knights a Baldric MUST always be worn.*)

QUALIFICATION GUIDE

All candidates for the Fourth Degree must be paid-up members of the Third Degree in good standing, and must have been a member of the Order for at least 1 year.

Third Degree Members of the Order for six months or more (but less than 1 year) (For this Exemplification the Candidate must have received the Honors of the First Degree on or before May 10, 2009.) may apply in writing to the Master for a waiver using the proper Waiver Request Form. The Master will forward the request to the Supreme Master for approval. The waiver request must contain the necessary information, and must be received on or before September 24, 2009 in order to allow time for processing.

Any waiver request received after September 26, 2009 must be accompanied by a check for \$28.80 to cover processing and handling fees, made out to "**Columbus 4th Degree Exemplification Fund**" and there is no guarantee that the waiver will be granted or processed in time for the Exemplification.
